Increased International Participation

This exciting event helped create a strong sense of community among attendees. In addition, GSA signed new MOUs with the Unión Geofísica Mexicana and the Sociedad Geológica Mexicana (see below for more details). This year, 1,553 international abstract authors contributed to Connects, representing 20.4% of all authors—a 2.4% increase over the previous year.

GSAI also made history at Connects 2024 by supporting four technical sessions, including the Society's first-ever session in Spanish—a remarkable milestone in GSA's 136-year history. The international table at the Connects Exhibit Hall buzzed with attendees exploring international opportunities and learning about GSAI's initiatives.

These accomplishments reflect GSAl's dedication to fostering partnerships, expanding global outreach, and strengthening GSA's position as a hub for international geoscientists. As GSAl looks ahead to **Connects 2025 in San Antonio, Texas, from 19–22 October**, we are eager to welcome you at the October 20, 2025 international reception and to build on this year's success.

Onema Adojoh's Journey from GSAI Travel Grant Awardee to Tenure-Track Professor - In His Own Words



Through the GSAI, I got a travel grant to attend the GSA meetings in Baltimore (2015) and Denver (2016).

Assistant Professor Department of Natural Sciences - Geology Northwest Missouri State University It was there where I met Dr. Francisca Ikuenobe (Missouri University of Science and Technology in Rolla) and Dr. Carlos Jaramillo (Smithsonian Research Institute in Panama), who both told me that they saw me give good presentations at different conferences and asked what I intend to do after my PhD graduation.

My response was that I need a postdoctoral research fellowship. To be honest, about the penultimate month to my PhD defense, Dr. Ikuenobe called to tell me that she selected me to be her new postdoctoral research fellow. Following the acceptance of the offer letter, I moved to the U.S. for the fellowship.

GSA Connects, being such a large event, takes me away from my academic routine every year since 2015 and has provided me with valuable learning and networking opportunities that offered me chances to hear from experienced professionals and rewardingly helped me to be hired from the University of Liverpool (UK) to undertake a postdoctoral fellowship at Missouri University of Science and Technology, Rolla.

Following the fellowship, I did get other adjunct and visiting professor positions in different US universities, but all be it, am currently a tenure track assistant professor at Northwest Missouri State University.

Based on my own successful experience, I urge early career / developing professionals and students to build on these guiding principles to actualize personal networking, learn, communicate/present well, make new friends, and foster professional links at conferences as you never can tell: your future job offer(s) may be right there close to you as you attend scientific conferences!"

FORGING STRONGER TIES: NEW MOUS SIGNED

The Geological Society of America (GSA) formalized partnerships with key geoscience organizations

across the Americas during 2024.

At Connects 2024, GSA President Christopher (Chuck) Bailey and Executive Director and CEO Melanie Brandt signed Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with the Unión Geofísica Mexicana (UGM) represented by its president, José Luis Macías Vázquez, and with the Sociedad Geológica Mexicana (SGM), represented by its president Rigoberto Ruiz Barragán.

In addition, GSA extended its network by signing MOUs in December 2024 with the Asociación Geológica Argentina (AGA), represented by its president Pablo José Pazos and vice president Cecilia del Papa, the Geological Society of Chile (SGCh), represented by its president Cristóbal Ramírez de Arellano Melo and vice president Pamela Jara, and the International Association for the Conservation of Geological Heritage (ProGEO), represented by its president Kevin Page and executive secretary Ewa Glowniak. GSA will celebrate these new partnerships at Connects 2025.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS FROM 2024

- Mary S. Hubbard, GSA's James B. Thompson, Jr. Distinguished International Lecturer 2023-2024 toured 6 countries, delivering lectures to 560 students and 210 faculty members, enhancing GSA's global outreach and engagement.
- Ester Sztein, Director of International Programs at GSA, visited Nairobi, Kenya, from February 19-23, 2024, for the International Union for Geological Sciences (IUGS) 79th Executive Committee Meeting and the Geoscience for Africa event. She presented a talk on transforming GSA's global impact to IUGS leadership and attendees from around the world.
- From April 14-19, 2024, GSA participated in the **European Geosciences Union (EGU)** meeting in Vienna, Austria, where President Chuck Bailey presented his research. GSA's booth was managed by April Leo, Kaleigh Fremgen, and Ester Sztein.
- GSA's staffers Ester Sztein, Josh Martin, and Anishma Acharya managed a booth at the International Conference of Young Scientists' U.S. Partnership Expo in Washington, D.C., on May 9, 2024, connecting with U.S. and international scientists, researchers, and policymakers.
- GSA International exhibited at the **Rocky Mountain/Cordilleran Joint Section Meeting in Spokane, Washington**, from May 15-17, 2024, engaging attendees in discussions on international aspects of geology and GSA's global initiatives.
- On July 1, 2024, **GSA** co-hosted a webinar with the Geological Society of Nigeria on "International Opportunities and Career Pathways for Geoscientists." The event offered valuable insights into career advancement and industry trends to the 142 attendees of this webinar. The recording is available in GSA's webinar library.
- GSA announced **Dr. Alan E. Fryar as the GSA's James B. Thompson, Jr. Distinguished International Lecturer 2024-2025**, following the conclusion of Mary S. Hubbard's term.

- Geological Society of London and GSA co-sponsored two hybrid conferences: **Digital Geoscience 2024: Intelligent Solutions in Geoscience** (29 October 2024) and **Geofutures: Planetary Geoscience Conference** (November 14-15).
- GSA honored **Dr. Bilal U. Haq** with the prestigious **International Distinguished Career Award**, celebrating his outstanding contributions to the field of geoscience.
- GSA was well represented at the **International Geological Congress (IGC)** with a prominent booth and a strong presence in the official U.S. delegation. GSA supported 24 U.S. graduate students and early-career scientists with travel awards, enabling them to present their research at this important international event.
- For the first time in GSA's 136-year history, a technical session at Connects was conducted in Spanish. This groundbreaking session, titled "T178. Presentaciones de Geociencias en Español I: Una Nueva Experiencia en una Reunión de GSA," marks a significant step toward inclusivity in the geosciences.
- **GSA signed new MOUs** with the Unión Geofísica Mexicana (UGM) and the Sociedad Geológica Mexicana (SGM), the Asociación Geológica Argentina (AGA), the Geological Society of Chile (SGCh), and the International Association for the Conservation of Geological Heritage (ProGEO) towards strengthening global geoscience collaborations.
- GSA was present at the November 2024 **Unión Geofísica Mexicana Annual Meeting in Puerto Vallarta**, where President Bailey gave a talk on geoheritage and Ester Sztein worked to strengthen the relationship with UGM, SGM, and other Mexican institutions.
- Ester Sztein traveled in November 2024 to San Luis, Argentina, to participate in the Argentine Geological Congress.
- Anishma Acharya and Ester Sztein represented GSAI at the American Geophysical Union meeting in December 2024 in Washington, DC.
- **GSAI bid farewell** to committee members Abhijit Mukherjee, Ibrahim Cemen, Isheka S. Orr and Maeve A. Boland, and welcomed new members Michael C. Wizevich, Gino Bianchi Mosquera, Fai Chanchai, and Florentin Maurrass.



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

On 17 December 2024, the **Biden Administration announced a rule that will streamline approvals for the H-1B visa program**. This program, created by Congress in 1990, allows U.S. employers to temporarily hire foreign workers in specialty occupations. The new rule is designed to give more flexibility to both employers and workers by updating the criteria for specialty occupations and for nonprofit and government research organizations that are exempt from the annual cap on H-1B visas. The rule also offers additional flexibility for F-1 visa students who want to transition to H-1B status, helping them avoid disruptions in their legal status and work authorization.

This action from the executive branch comes alongside a new bill (<u>H.R. 10375</u>, introduced in Congress on 11 December and sent to the House Judiciary Committee) aimed at strengthening the American mining workforce through international collaborations. The bill would allow foreign engineers specializing in critical minerals to work full-time in the U.S.; encourage educational partnerships, research collaborations, joint degree programs, and training initiatives between U.S. and foreign institutions; and provide funding for scholarships, fellowships, and grants to support professional development in critical minerals sectors globally.

GSA, including GSAI, had an incredible presence at the recent **AGU Fall Meeting held on 9-13 December at Washington DC,** creating a dynamic space for geoscientists from across the globe to connect, engage, and learn about the Society's diverse offerings.

Our booth was abuzz with activity throughout the event, with members and visitors stopping by to renew and enroll memberships, explore our initiatives, and discover the breadth of opportunities GSA offers. GSA showcased over 60 titles from Mountain Press's Geology Series, a recent and exciting acquisition by GSA. Visitors were also thrilled to learn about GSA's professional development resources, offering U.S. and international travel and research grants, networking, and career support.

EXPLORING GEOTHERMAL ENERGY

A Collaborative Webinar by The Geological Society of America (GSA) and the Geological Society of Africa (GSAf)







On 12 December, GSA and GSAf recently co-organized an engaging webinar, **Energy Transition I: Geothermal Energy**, featuring:

Dr. David T. Wang (Technology Manager, U.S. Department of Energy), who discussed the science and potential of geothermal energy, with a focus on its market potential and current R&D priorities at the Department of Energy.

Dr. Isaack Kanda (Chief Geochemist, Geothermal Development Corporation, Kenya), who presented a case study from Kenya, emphasizing insights from the African perspective and strategies to overcome barriers to implementation.

The webinar, which attracted over 200 registrants from 32 countries and attended by 78 participants, emphasized the global importance of geothermal energy in driving sustainable energy transitions. Participants submitted thoughtful and relevant questions, sparking dynamic discussions on topics ranging from site selection and low-temperature geothermal sources to challenges like well clogging and utilizing unconventional energy sources.

Dr. Wang and Dr. Kanda's explanations showcased the immense potential of geothermal energy to meet global energy needs, with particular relevance to both advanced and emerging economies. Thanks go to Dr. Onema Adojoh (Northwest Missouri State University; GSA) and Dr. Daniel Kwayisi (University of Ghana; GSAf), for organizing this event together with GSA staff!

For those who missed this vibrant session, a recording will soon be available in the <u>GSA</u> <u>Webinar Library</u>. The event's success highlights the value of cross-continental collaboration and knowledge-sharing in advancing geoscience. ARGENTINE GEOLOGICAL CONGRESS

The XXII Argentine Geological Congress was held on 17-22 November, 2024 in San Luis, Argentina. Participants included hundreds of scientists from many Argentinian institutions and numerous students and early career researchers together with many international participants. The first keynote speaker was Prof. Suzanne Kay, past president of GSA, who spoke of her decades of scientific work in Argentina. Ester Sztein participated in the meeting and worked towards the agreements with both the Asociación Geológica Argentina and the Sociedad Geológica de Chile, which were signed in December 2024.



UNIÓN GEOFÍSICA MEXICANA ANNUAL MEETING (RAUGM)

This meeting took place on 27 October - 1 November in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. This yearly event convenes Mexican and international geoscientists from all career stages. President Chuck Bailey gave a presentation on geoheritage, and Ester Sztein held several meetings with Mexican colleagues to define next steps and activities between the UGM and GSA, and between SGM and GSA.

GSA had the pleasure of co-sponsoring the Kermés de las Ciencias de la Tierra y del Espacio (Earth and Space Sciences Fair) on 29 October in central Puerto Vallarta as part of the RAUGM. A total of 530 enthusiastic participants from eight K-12 local schools attended this day-long event to broaden their perspectives and deepen their interest in earth and space sciences.
